Letter from the Chair



These are different and interesting times. With the Coronavirus (COVID-19) looming and the government issuing stay at home orders, the Board of Directors has suspended meetings and closed the doors on the Chipley Historical Center until safer days. Before we closed, we welcomed three new members to our board: Cindy Bowden, Lorraine Berry, and Patrick Severts. Patrick and Cindy have 70 years of museum experience between the two of them and Lorraine is a fund raising master.

A few months ago, the owner of the Flying Tiger display decided to donate the display to a museum in Arizona that specializes in Flying Tigers. We will miss the display but hope it has found a good home.

During the February rains we developed a leak in the roof in the front of the building. The Town of Pine Mountain has since repaired the roof. Because of the Coronavirus the new museum has stalled but the Board of Directors is not resting. We are planning a new flow and perhaps better organization for our collection. Lou Brackett has been hard at work directing an inventory of all of the items in our collection for several months now. This is a slow paced job that requires a photograph and documentation of each item. This is much more professional than the way items were collected in the past. We are planning several programs that are sure to be of interest when we can finally gather in larger groups again. Some are hands on and will be of special interest to children like papermaking. We are working to get a traveling exhibit from the Smithsonian in Washington, DC to be on display from time to time. Cindy Bowden is working on a traveling display from our museum that will highlight the life and works of Horace Green. Several organizations in surrounding counties have shown interest and are willing to help with the display. These are just some of our projects. Please stop by when we open our doors again.

Pine Mountain Then and Now

One of the most interesting artifacts at the Chipley Historical Center is a large aerial photo of downtown Chipley taken in the 1950s. Even now, after seventy years, it is still easy to get one's bearings and pick out some of the locations in town. One of our board members mentioned that it would be nice to get a current aerial photo and hang them side-by-side for comparison. Technology has certainly changed in seven decades, and instead of a plane, this time Steve Taylor of Midland, Georgia, was kind enough to make us a new photo using his drone. The new photo will be framed and hung next to the old one as soon as the current stay-at-home order is lifted. 




Buy a Brick Program
