**Murderer Crawford Goes to His Grave
by the Poison Route.**

MACON, GA., Sept. 30.—At Chipley last week R. S. Sheppard, a highly respected citizen, was shot and killed by John Crawford. Crawford had circulated slanderous reports by Sheppard's daughter, and the father had gone to Crawford to sign papers denying the slanders, when Crawford killed him. The murderer fled and has been in hiding since. A special from Greenville, Ga., to-day says that Sunday night Crawford came to his brother's house and asked for lodging for the night, which was given him. Later in the night his brother entered the room where the murderer was and found him dead in bed. A bottle partly filled with strychnine was near by, and there was every sign of deliberate suicide.

Therefore, be it resolved by the citizens in mass meeting assembled that we, as a community, do most heartily condemn and unqualifiedly denounce such an outrageous crime, and will use all the means in our reach to bring the villainous murderer to justice.

That we deeply sympathize with the sad bereaved family in the murder of a kind loving husband, and an affectionate father, who lost his life in an honest, peaceable and commendable effort to protect the purity of his home, and vindicate the good name of his loved ones.

That we, as neighbors utterly repudiate as infamously, false and slanderous imputations made by Jas. H. Crawford against the virtue or good character of the sicken family, and that we hereby express to them our confidence, and pledge for them our sympathy and protection.

That these resolution be published in the Merriwether Vindicator, Hamilton Journal, Atlanta Journal, and Atlanta Constitution, and that a copy be furnished to the bereaved family.

5th. That while we miss our brother that a page on the minutes of the lodge with his name inscribed there on be held sacred to his memory.

6th. That we shall so gauge our walk, divide our time, and encompass our desires that where we shall be commanded to look to the east and behold our Grand Master arrayed in all his glory that we too will be counted worthy of the Lamb and ordered to be seated by the side of our deceased brother, making the broken chain a new and everlasting one around the Great High Throne in the Celestial lodge. As a girl she was modest, gentle, hopeful and good; as a young woman she was much admired on account of her sweet manners and cheerful disposition; as a wife and mother she had no superiors. She was born 5-31-1836. In 1875 she joined the Bethany Baptist Church and was baptized by Rev. John Harris. From her connection with the church until her death she was a faithful member. The confidence of the people in her religious life was so implicit that she was often referred to as the model Christian woman.

About thirty-three years ago she was taken with a severe rheumatism that made her a cripple for life. For 30 years she never walked a step. It was always sad, but yet a pleasant sight to see her enter the church she loved so well borne upon the arms of her devoted sons. Though sorely afflicted, her bright smiles and cheerful words made her home one of the most delightful places to visit in all the country. Her unusually cheerful nature was wine to her own soul and sunshine to all who knew her. Even in her last affliction she was so full of hope and gladsome words that the writer remarked to her a few days before her death that he believed she would die with a smile upon her lips—and this was almost literally true.

REV. R. H. BULLOCH DEAD.

On Monday morning at about 7 o'clock the soul of Rev. R. H. Bulloch of Chipley took its flight. He had been in ill health for some weeks. During the recent sleet and snow he received a fall from his back door and from this fall he never recovered.

He had been lying at the point of death for several days during which time his departure was hourly expected.

Chipley, Ga., December 4.—(Special) ed. she found his lifeless body in his chair. The person who murdered him used a shot gun. Standing outside, he took deliberately aim and fired through the window, the charge shattering the glass, striking Mr. Brooks in the head and evidently killing him instantly. The deceased was a middle-aged man who had resided at Chipley for a number of years and was highly respected by all. He was the manager of C. H. Mr. Brooks was alone in his room, sitting before the fire, at the time he met such a tragic death. His wife was back about the rear of the house at the time she heard the shot but supposed that it was her husband or someone else shooting at a dog. When she went to her husband's room, never dreaming that an awful tragedy had been enacted.

Starting to cross the track near the Chevrolet building he failed to respond to the engineer's most solemn warning as the train pulled out of the deep cut, and was caught by the engine and thrown several feet to the right of the track. He was angling southeasterly, and his left arm, ribs and leg were badly broken and a piece of skull the size of a man's finger was torn out of from behind his ear. In 20 or 30 minutes his body was completely lifeless and his faithful spirit was gone to God who gave it.

John Wallace Laid to Rest At Simple Rites at Chipley

CHIPLEY, Ga., Nov. 4—Hundreds of relatives, friends and idle curious jammed into the Chipley Methodist church this afternoon to witness the final chapter in the John Wallace story.

The church auditorium overflowed into the annex and basement as simple services were said for the wealthy landowner who died in Georgia's electric chair shortly before noon Friday for murder.

"Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord," said the minister as he stood beside the simple grave underneath the green, rain-soaked canopy.

Wind blew down the rows of flowers which had been placed beside the gray casket. Heads were low.

This was the end of the story which had begun in 1943 with the murder of a Wallace tenant farmer, William Turner.

Kin Lingers
Mrs. Wallace did not attend the service.

But a small band of close kin lingered for a last look at the cold, gray casket which was silhouetted against the few strands of flowers and the low-hanging, ominous clouds in the distant and over-head. Most of the curious had long since drifted silently away from the hillside burial ground. Only the simple white and red

And above all else, he said I love everybody."

Going Home
"It was a rare and inspiring attitude," he said.

Dr. Allen quoted from the last letter which he said Wallace wrote:

"I'm going to the home of many mansions... don't worry about me," he quoted the letter. A rainy wind rustled the leaves in a nearby tree.

Then the crowded audience stood for the final prayer. Soft organ music filled every corner of the building.

"We leave his soul with You," the minister concluded.

The crowd fled silently out into the rain.

John Wallace had come home for the last time.

County Has First Auto Fatality Of This Year

According to the State Patrol, the accident occurred at 11:20 a.m. when Earnest, traveling north on Hwy 27, lost control of a dump truck and overturned one mile south of Pine Mountain.

In a report by Trooper 1st Class J. Jordan, of the LaGrange State Patrol Post, a witness said as he was meeting the truck the cab seemed filled

Also in his report, Jordan said his investigations revealed that the engine of the truck was only slightly damaged by heat, while

all the insulation was burned off the electrical wires. The battery became disconnected at the

time of the accident. He said this leads him to believe that there was an electrical fire in the cab, which caused enough

smoke to distract or incapacitate the driver, causing him to lose control of the truck.

The State Patrol said this is the first auto fatality this year for both Harris and Troup counties.

Alvin Davis Former President Of Callaway Gardens, Dies

Former Callaway Gardens President Alvin S. Davis, 67, of Pine Bluff, Ga., passed away Sunday, March 25 at the West Georgia Medical Center in LaGrange. Mr. Davis had worked 15

years with Callaway Mills in LaGrange and was director of industrial relations with the company when he was named vice president of the late Cassin Callaway Foundation in April 1961.

In January 1965, he was named president of Callaway Gardens, succeeding then-3rd District Congressman Howard "Bo" Callaway. Most of the resort's cottages, golf courses and motel rooms were built during Mr. Davis' tenure as an executive with the Gardens' operations staff.

He left Callaway Gardens in September 1966 to assume an executive position with Jefferson Mills Inc., but later built and developed Davis Inn of Pine Mountain.

Mr. Davis and his wife, Mildred Miller Davis, operated the 25-room inn near their home on State Park Road in Pine Mountain until they sold the enterprise to Don W. Taylor after Mr. Davis became ill in 1983.

Born March 3, 1917, in Rome, he graduated with honors from The University of Georgia with bachelor's and master's degrees. He married Mildred Miller of Carrollton, in 1946, and served in World War II as an officer in the U.S. Navy.

He moved to Harris County in 1961 from LaGrange, where he had lived since 1946. He was a member of Pine Mountain First Baptist Church.

Mr. and Mrs. Davis developed the Davis Inn, a 25

room deluxe inn near their home on State Park Road in Pine Mountain. It is noted for its distinctive architecture and custom decorated rooms which they designed and operated together with personality and hospitality that made the inn almost an extension of their own home. Mr. Davis also designed, planted, and maintained the beautifully landscaped grounds and gardens surrounding the inn—planting more than a thousand annuals each year so that beautiful flowers were always abundant. When Mr. Davis became ill in 1983, they sold the inn to Mr. Don W. Taylor.

Mr. Davis was a charter member of the Georgia Hospitality and Travel Association and never missed a board meeting until his illness. He was named "Hotel Man of the Year" in 1980 and "Travel Man of the Year" in 1988. Following the sale of Davis Inn and his resignation from the board, he was given an honorary life membership. He has also served as chairman of the Public Relations Committee of the Georgia Textile Manufacturers Association, as director of the (then) Georgia State Highway 27 Association, and as a

member of the board of the Southern Industrial Relations Conference.

Mr. Davis worked for years with various youth organizations and served on the Georgia 4-H Advisory Committee since its formation in 1952. He was selected Honorary Master 4-H member and was Georgia 4-H alumni winner in 1968 and was honored nationally in 1969 as one of six national 4-H leadership. He holds the coveted Silver Beaver award and served as President of the West Georgia Council.

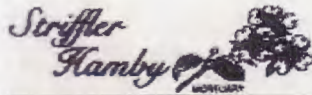

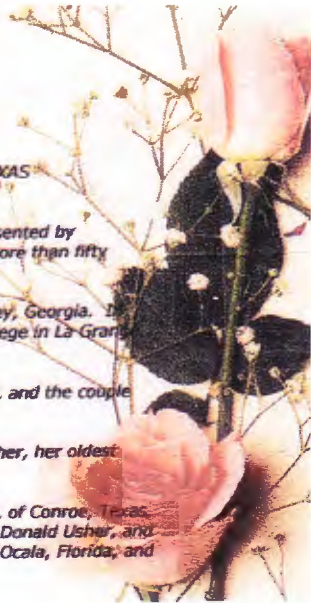

She said that "people think they shouldn't talk to me while I play, but my fingers can play the music". During that time she was also organist at the First Baptist Church in Pine Mountain and, with her husband, Alvin, developed and managed Davis Inn (later sold to Chick-Fil-A for their IMPACT 360 Youth Training Program).

Earlier she had been organist at First Baptist Church in LaGrange for 27 years. In total, she was a church organist for more than seven decades!

Born June 3, 1918, in Carrollton to O.S. and Norville Miller, Mildred began her life of faith and music by committing her life to Jesus at the age of 12 and becoming organist at her church in Carrollton while a sophomore in high school. She was awarded a scholarship to Shorter College in Rome where she graduated with a Bachelor of Music Degree in piano in 1939 and went on to study at the Oberlin Conservatory in Ohio and subsequently at the Juilliard School of Music.

While her formal education and prestigious awards were in classical music and piano performance, the ultimate professional love of her life was in playing hymns that people love. While she played she would encourage them in their faith by talking with them about the meaning of the words of the hymns and her own walk with Christ. Mildred said that "she maintained a continuous conversation with God", trusting him to guide her in every moment, and she had "never found his line busy".

Mildred's other great interests were in cooking, Bible study, and serving people. She loved to experiment with recipes to perfect them according to her tastes and then label them "My Recipes. A great hostess, she cooked for and entertained large and small groups of family, friends, visiting pastors, and her choir, as well as taking her cooking to the sick or shut-in. Her fame as a cook grew rapidly when, in 1952, Grace Hartley, the Food Editor for the Atlanta Journal, visited Mildred in her home and photographed the Journal's first color food photos in a private home and featured many of her recipes. Mildred also loved to study the Bible and specially prepared for the weekly Bible Study at her church. Because of the daily application to her own life of what she read, she was a great encourager of other church members, visitors to the Chapel, and even her own pastors.

Although life dealt her some blows, including a bout with cancer in the late '70s and the death of Alvin in 1984, she retained her spirit of faith and joy until her death. Even while Alzheimer's caused her to lose most of her capabilities in the last few years of her life, even her ability to talk coherently with her own family, she was at her most coherent when she prayed, always thankfully and with contentment, and when she expressed her love to family and all who ministered to her during her residence at Sunrise Assisted Living. In the most real sense possible, Mildred will be "Home for Christmas".

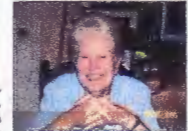

R. Lee Mobley, 59, service manager of the Huguley-Scott Motor Company, and his 48-year-old wife and 16-year-old daughter, Marie, were found dead of pistol wounds in their home here late tonight.

Troup County Sheriff E. V. Hilyer said a gun was found in the hand of Mobley, indicating he had shot his wife and daughter and then killed himself. Apparently all three had been dead about 24 hours, he said.

The bodies were discovered by West Point Policeman Lovett Sappington, brother-in-law of Mobley, after Mobley failed to come to work this morning.

Mobley and his wife were found on a bedroom floor and the daughter, their only child, was found on the bed. The gun in the man's hand had been fired five times.

The family was well known in West Point and neighbors knew of no reason for the shooting, Sheriff Hilyer said.
